A reminder that our Safer Internet Day Poster Competition is running and we have spoken to the children about this to remind them. We really would love to see as many posters as possible around school.





LOOK what we're LEARNING!

Reception



What an exciting week it's been! We're so proud of the hard work and progress your children have made. Here are some highlights:

In phonics, the children explored the sounds 'air' and 'er.' They enjoyed the playful imagery of "chair in the air" and imagined a "bigger digger" to bring these sounds to life. They've also been practicing blending double letters in longer words like "rubb-er" and "rabb-it" – fantastic progress!

Our 'Maths Marvels' focused on the numbers 6, 7, and 8, plus 1 more and 1 less. We've been singing '10 Green Bottles' to help reinforce these concepts, and the children love joining in during our corridor walks to and from the hall!

This week, our Reception superstars have been doing some fabulous writing. They've been using magnetic letters to build words with all the new GCPs they've learnt so far this term. It's wonderful to see their growing confidence as they explore writing and spelling.



We've also sent home new reading books: *Pat a Pan*, *Tap it Tad*, and *Jet and Jazz*. Please keep reading with your child and celebrate their progress in their reading diaries – your support makes a big difference.

On Thursday, the children participated in the RSPCA's Bird Watch 2025, counting bird species around the school (and the squirrels seemed to enjoy the bird food too!). They shared their results as part of the national survey.

This week, our fine motor skills focus has been on **cutting**. The children have been cutting out Arctic and Antarctic animals, number tiles, and snowmen. They've been building their muscle strength each day, and we'd love to continue this progress at home. If you're able to help by practising cutting with your child, it will really support the skills they've been developing.



In **RE**, the children have begun learning about the Hindu festival of **Holi**. They were so creative as they tore tissue paper and stuck it onto their artwork to create their own vibrant "explosions" of colour. What a wonderful way to celebrate this festival of colour!

We're gearing up for our **Superhero Day on Monday 10th February!** Children are invited to come dressed as their favourite superhero or in their 'civilian' disguise. We'd also love for children to share a picture or story about a superhero who has made a difference in their life, whether it's someone they know personally or a real-life hero they admire. It's sure to be a day full of fun and inspiration!

Thank you for your continued support and encouragement at home, we couldn't be prouder of all their hard work and achievements this week.



Year 1 and Year 2



In English this week, we have continued our writing journey on Paddington. Last week the children wrote a character description of Paddington and this week they have been working really hard on generating vocabulary to write a setting description of Buckingham Palace! The children are continually working on their handwriting and ensuring their sentences are finished properly, with full stops and capital letters. Their ability to do this independently has progressed so much!



In Maths this week, Year 1 children have continued to deepen their knowledge on place value within 20 by applying this to new learning on addition and subtraction. They have been looking very closely at doubles and near doubles and how these facts can help them work out additions quickly! In Year 2, children have started a new topic on multiplication, this week they have participated in practical activities to consolidate their knowledge on equal groups and they have started to look at repeated addition and multiplication number sentences.



In History this week, we were looking at how technology has changed how we talk and communicate. The children had a go at some hands-on communication, in pairs they were given a scenario and using role-play they had to decide the best way to communicate their message to each other, they could choose from video-call, texting, sending letters, calling or emailing! The children loved this activity and they were intrigued to have a look at what mobile phones used to look like!



Developing our Science, this week the children explored the vocabulary: carnivore, herbivore and omnivore. They then worked in groups to read through Animal fact cards and classify what diet each animal ate. The children showed excellent team work throughout this task.

As part of our Art project this term, the children have been designing their own creativity medals. This week we focused on shape, the children experimented with what shapes they may want to use in their designs. They then practiced some cutting skills and created some medals only made out of shapes in their sketchbooks!

The children became very creative with this task.

Year 3 and Year 4

We've had a wonderful and productive week in our Year 3 and 4 class! The children have been engaged in a range of exciting lessons, building on their knowledge and developing new skills. Here's what we've been up to:



Science – This week, we became published scientists! The children worked hard to compile their knowledge from previous lessons into an informative report on changes of state and the water cycle. They explained key concepts, including evaporation, condensation, and precipitation, demonstrating a fantastic understanding of how water moves through our environment.

History – We stepped back in time to learn about the Roman army and what made it so powerful. The children explored the equipment used by Roman soldiers and the strategic tactics that helped them win battles. They even had the chance to line up in formations, mimicking Roman battle strategies, and discussed how these would have helped the soldiers stay protected and organised.

Geography – Using iPads, we researched key features and landmarks of the West Midlands. The children enjoyed using technology to discover interesting facts about their local area, from famous buildings to natural landscapes. Their enthusiasm in sharing their findings was brilliant!

Music – Our music lessons this week had a digital twist as we used virtual keyboards to play parts of the backing track for *Three Little Birds*. The children developed their musical skills while working on timing and rhythm, and it was great to see their confidence grow!

PSHE – Continuing our work on families, we discussed different ways we show care and appreciation for one another. The children shared thoughtful ideas and reflected on the importance of kindness within families.

Well done to everyone for their fantastic efforts this week. Have a lovely weekend!



Year 5



In Year 5, our students have been exploring the fascinating world of physical processes, including filtration, sieving, and evaporation. They have been investigating how these methods can be used to separate mixtures, learning about their real-life applications in everyday life. Through hands-on activities, the children have filtered water, sieved materials, and observed evaporation, gaining a deeper understanding of how each process works. This exciting learning journey has allowed them to see science in action, developing both their practical skills and scientific thinking. It's been a fantastic way to inspire curiosity and foster a love of science!

In English children have been learning how to use relative clauses

in their writing. They've been using *The Lost Happy Endings* to help them practice adding more detail to their sentences. By looking at characters and settings in the story, they've been learning how to join ideas together using relative clauses. This is helping them to write clearer and more interesting sentences. The children are gaining confidence in using these clauses to make their writing more descriptive and exciting. It's been a fun way to enhance their writing skills and creativity!



In Maths children have been learning how to multiply unit and non-unit fractions. They started by practicing with simple fractions and gradually moved on to harder ones. Next, they began working with mixed fractions, learning how to multiply them step by step. Through lots of practice and fun activities, the children are building their confidence with fractions and will soon be able to multiply mixed fractions easily.

Year 6



Year 6 have had a great week.


We have been working with decimals in their maths, using place value knowledge with up to three decimal places. In writing, we have been practising grammar skills as we are continuing our journey of writing a build up with the intent of creating tension. In reading, we loved retrieving and summarising facts about Chinese New Year from a report.

As scientists, we completed an experiment with a focus on predicting how we could separate different mixtures such as oil and water from what we know about their material properties.

In art, we made more visual notes on artists to further develop our own ideas around designing a setting for an animation, focussing on Roald Dahl's Esio Trot.



In History, we continued to learn about the Maya by discussing sources to debate why they were such a successful civilisation. As geographers, we continued recapping and practising our map-reading skills as we described different countries locations in relevance to one another. In music, we composed our own tunes to a new piece of Jazz music and in Computing we began to use HTML to begin developing our own websites!


