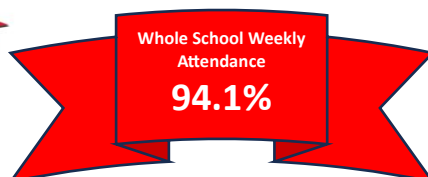

Year 3/4



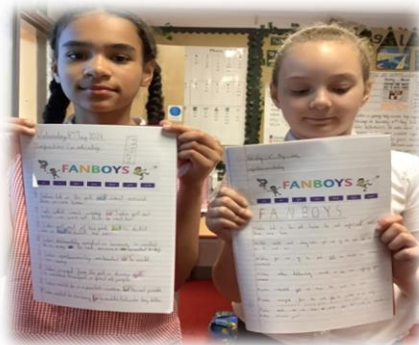


Year 5

Our Year 6 Class of 24! We are beyond proud of you for your attitudes to learning this week. Have the best weekend, have fun and rest – and we will see you Monday

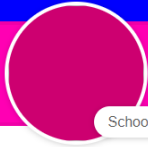
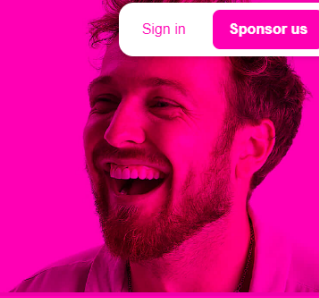
