Good afternoon everyone,

What a week it has been. The Euros have kicked off and we've seen 2 of England's matches. I'm sure lots of you out there will be watching – I know Tuesday's game is one that many are talking about.

In school we are getting busier! It is notoriously said that Summer 2 is the busiest of all the terms – as we are trying to end this year positively and also begin to plan the new academic year which is super exciting!






Reception

Year 1 and 2










Year 3 and Year 4



"They came in their hundreds. They came in their thousands. They came in their hundreds of thousands. An apocalypse of rats spreading terror and disease through Hamelin town.'




Year 4 have also been working on speeding up their recall of multiplication facts using Times Tables Rockstars before exploring 2d shapes through their understanding of angles, sides and lines of symmetry.

Year 5



Year 5 have also been learning all about the 'The Erie Canal Song,' also known as 'Low Bridge, Everybody Down,' it was first published in 1905 by Thomas Allen. Reacting to the changeover from mule power to powered barges and tugboats. They practised singing the song in reggae style and thoroughly enjoyed it.



This week in Maths and Arithmetic lessons, Year 5 have been recapping on decimal numbers. We have been working on identifying the place value of decimal numbers, adding decimal numbers and subtracting decimal numbers. The children have worked hard to solve problem involving decimal numbers too.

Year 6 have been getting creative on TinkerCad by exploring many aspects of shape and geometry in order to create real life 3D concepts and modelling. In math's we have been looking at decimals and statistics, while in English we have been exploring the story of Macbeth in order to create a piece of persuasive writing from the perspective of the main characters.


